Think Charitably

1 Corinthians 4:1-7

Big Idea: Jesus' judgment of us, in the church, as leaders and as fellow Christians, is enough. And it frees us to think charitably about one another, rather than critically judging one another.



- I. Seeing leaders correctly.-vs. 1-2
 - A. Reminders of Paul's instruction in 1 Corinthians:
 - "For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarreling among you, my brothers. What I mean is that each one of you says, 'I follow Paul,' or 'I follow Apollos,' or 'I follow Cephas,' or 'I follow Christ.'" (1 Cor. 1:11-12, ESV)
 - "For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles..." (1 Cor. 1:21-23, ESV)
 - "But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God." (1 Cor. 1:27-30, ESV)
 - "And I was with you in weakness and in fear and much trembling, and my speech and my message were not in plausible words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith might not rest in the wisdom of men but in the power of God." (1 Cor. 2:3-5, ESV)
 - "What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you believed, as the Lord assigned to each. I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth." (1 Cor. 3:5-7, ESV)
 - "So let no one boast in men. For all things are yours, whether Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future—all are yours, and you are Christ's, and Christ is God's." (1 Cor. 3:21-23. ESV)
 - B. What leaders are and what they do.
 - "This is how one should regard us, as <u>servants of Christ</u> and <u>stewards of the mysteries of God</u>." (1 Cor. 4:1, ESV)
 - "Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful." (1 Cor. 4:2, ESV)
 - C. Questions: How do you view leaders in Christ's church? Are you looking at the wrong criteria for those serving Jesus' church? Are you seeing leaders correctly?

- II. Understanding the Lord's judgment.-vs. 3-5
 - A. "But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by any human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself." (1 Cor. 4:3, ESV)
 - "It appears that some Corinthians believers were quite prepared to write off certain Christian leaders, simply because they preferred to follow some other leaders as a guru. To elevate one leader and offer him or her the allegiance that belongs to God is bad enough; to write off all authority in any other Christian leader not only betrays a woeful lack of courtesy, but it places the self-appointed judge in the place of God." D.A. Carson
 - B. "Therefore do not pronounce judgment before the time, before the Lord comes, who will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Then each one will receive his commendation from God." (1 Cor. 4:5, ESV)
 - C. Application:
 - 1. The only true judge of the human heart, is God.
 - 2. The freedom of self-forgetfulness.
 - "Paul does not look to the Corinthians for his identity. He does not go to them for the verdict that he is a 'somebody'. He does not get that sense of identity from them. But he does not get it from himself either. He knows that trying to find self-esteem by living up to a certain set of standards is a trap." Tim Keller
 - "Paul is saying that he has reached a place where his ego draws no more attention to itself than any other part of his body. He has reached the place where he is not thinking about himself anymore. When he does something wrong or something good, he does not connect it to himself any more. Gospel-humility is not needing to think about myself. True gospel-humility means I stop connecting every experience, every conversation, with myself. In fact, I stop thinking about myself. The freedom of self-forgetfulness. The blessed rest that only self-forgetfulness brings." Tim Keller
 - 3. God will bring all things to light & we can rest in His care.
- III. Seeing ourselves correctly. -vs. 6-7
 - A. "I have applied all these things to myself and Apollos for your benefit, brothers, that you may learn by us not to go beyond what is written, that none of you may be puffed up in favor of one against another." (1 Cor. 4:6, ESV)
 - B. "For who sees anything different in you? What do you have that you did not receive? If then you received it, why do you boast as if you did not receive it?" (1 Cor. 4:7, ESV)
